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What is medical malpractice?

- Malpractice- preventable adverse event due to
 - Negligence
 - Malicious intent

4 elements of a malpractice claim

- Assumed existence of a patient/physician relationship
- Deviation from the standard of care
- Preventable injury sustained by a patient
- Proof that the physician's actions have caused the injury
- Plaintiff has burden of proof

Have we gone too far?

Doctors are more likely to be sued if patients feel they are rude, rush visits or fail to answer questions.



1994 Survey

- One study found no difference in the technical care provided by doctors who had been sued and those who had not.
- "... a doctor might not have done anything technically wrong but generated enough misunderstanding and anger to provoke a malpractice claim," said Dr. Gerald Hickson, an author of the study.



• An average of 45 months to resolve a malpractice claim

Economic burden on physicians

- High cost of liability insurance drives doctors away from the profession
- Median award for malpractice cases is 16 times higher than those for other torts and has risen 60% from 93 to 99
- 1/3 of plaintiffs' winners awarded \$1 million or more

Consequences for society

- In PA, due to high premiums:
 - 13% of OBGYN's have stopped delivering babies
 - Alleghany county will lose 2 neurosurgeons a year
- In West Virginia
 - ¹/₂ of doctors were sued over a 5 year period

Possible solutions

- Trying physicians before professional peers
 - New Mexico
- Capping personal injury claims
 - Texas proposition 12
